Neighborhood Watch Committee Chair

The Committee Chair is responsible for keeping records updated, arranging meetings, and reporting Neighborhood Watch Committee activity and information to the Five Canyons HOA Board of Directors at the bi-monthly meetings. The Committee Chair has two backups identified from the group of Neighborhood Captains.

Neighborhood Captains

A Neighborhood Captain is located in each Five Canyons HOA neighborhood. Neighborhood Captains keep lists of phone numbers and email addresses of:

- 1) All Street Captains in their neighborhood.
- 2) Other Neighborhood Captains and the Neighborhood Watch Committee Chair.

Neighborhood Captains are responsible for passing messages to the Street Captains in their neighborhoods from the HOA Board of Directors, Committee Chair, Walsh PM, or Sheriff. Neighborhood Captains are needed for the following neighborhoods:

Street Captains

One Street Captain for each street (more if the street is long) to communicate with – and pass messages to – residents on the same street, and collect phone numbers and email addresses. Residents are given a phone card with numbers to the Sheriff, Security, and Walsh PM. Street Captains may hold street meetings if necessary.

Neighborhood Watch Network

Five Canyons HOA Board of Directors, Walsh PM, and the Sheriff can activate Five Canyons Watch by phoning the Committee chair and/or Neighborhood Captains. Messages are passed to Street Captains, and then to residents.

A good communications infrastructure is absolutely necessary for an effective Neighborhood Watch program.

The communication network enables neighbors to know when others are on vacation, alert neighbors of strangers or unusual activity, etc. Some residents may share phone numbers of relatives so they may be alerted if the residents are away from home for an extended period of time. Your street can make decisions on how best to help each other out.
